

DART staff recommends renaming three light rail stations

Apparently one name for each station isn't enough for [DART](#) and some of its partners in the cities of Dallas and [Irving](#). The staff, acting on requests by the cities and the Dallas Arts District, will urge DART's board to consider changing the names of three of its light rail stations today.

The City of Dallas wants Cityplace Station to be remained Cityplace/Uptown Station. The Dallas Arts District wants Pearl Station to be renamed "Pearl/Arts District Station." And the city of Irving wants South Irving Station to be renamed Downtown Irving/Heritage Crossing Station."

That's a lot of names/words to get out of your mouth when you are talking transit, but I suppose the branding possibilities were just too much to ignore.

DART staff is recommending that the changes be approved by the planning committee. Final action isn't expected until next month.

The requesting parties will have to cover the cost of renaming the stations, according to DART policy.
