1 (1) The chair shall recognize the reading clerk to
2 read the resolutions within each category on the calendar only by
3 number, type of resolution, author or sponsor, and name of the
4 person or persons designated in the resolutions, except for those
5 resolutions that have been withdrawn or that are required to be read
6 in full. The resolutions read by the clerk shall then be adopted in
7 one motion for each category.

8 (2) Subsequent to the adoption of the resolutions read
9 by the clerk, the chair shall proceed to lay before the house the
10 resolutions on the calendar that are required to be read in full.
11 Each such resolution shall be read and adopted individually.

12 (3) If it develops that any resolution on the
13 congratulatory and memorial calendar does not belong on that
14 calendar, the chair shall withdraw the resolution from further
15 consideration, remove it from the calendar, and refer it to the
16 appropriate calendars committee for placement on the proper
17 calendar.

18 Sec. 13. PERIODS FOR CONSIDERATION OF LOCAL, CONSENT, AND
19 RESOLUTIONS CALENDARS. (a) As the volume of legislation shall
20 warrant, the chair of the Committee on Local and Consent Calendars
21 shall move to designate periods for the consideration of local,
22 consent, and resolutions calendars. Each such motion shall require
23 a two-thirds vote for its adoption. In each instance, the Committee
24 on Local and Consent Calendars shall prepare and post on the
25 electronic legislative information system a ~~[distribute to each~~
26 ~~member a printed]~~ calendar at least 48 hours in advance of the hour
27 set for consideration. Once a ~~[printed]~~ calendar is posted

1 [~~distributed~~], no additional bills or resolutions will be added to
2 it. This requirement can be suspended only by unanimous consent. No
3 local, consent, and resolutions calendar may be considered by the
4 house if it is determined that the rules of the house were not
5 complied with by the Committee on Local and Consent Calendars in
6 preparing that calendar.

7 (b) The period designated for the consideration of a local,
8 consent, and resolutions calendar under this section or under a
9 special order under Section 2 of this rule may not exceed one
10 calendar day.

11 Sec. 14. PROCEDURE FOR CONSIDERATION OF LOCAL, CONSENT, AND
12 RESOLUTIONS CALENDARS. During the consideration of a local,
13 consent, and resolutions calendar set by the Committee on Local and
14 Consent Calendars the following procedures shall be observed:

15 (1) The chair shall allow the sponsor of each bill or
16 resolution three minutes to explain the measure, and the time shall
17 not be extended except by unanimous consent of the house. This rule
18 shall have precedence over all other rules limiting time for
19 debate.

20 (2) If it develops that any bill or resolution on a
21 local, consent, and resolutions calendar is to be contested on the
22 floor of the house, the chair shall withdraw the bill or resolution
23 from further consideration and remove it from the calendar.

24 (3) Any bill or resolution on a local, consent, and
25 resolutions calendar shall be considered contested if notice is
26 given by five or more members that they intend to oppose the bill or
27 resolution, either by a raising of hands or the delivery of written

1 notice to the chair.

2 (4) Any bill or resolution on a local, consent, and
3 resolutions calendar shall be considered contested if debate
4 exceeds 10 minutes. The chair shall strictly enforce this time
5 limit and automatically withdraw the bill from further
6 consideration if the time limit herein imposed is exceeded.

7 (5) Any bill or resolution on a local, consent, and
8 resolutions calendar that is not reached for floor consideration
9 because of the expiration of the calendar day period for
10 consideration established by Section 13 of this rule shall carry
11 over onto the next local, consent, and resolutions calendar. Bills
12 or resolutions that carry over must appear in the same relative
13 order as on the calendar on which the bills or resolutions initially
14 appeared, and bills or resolutions originally from older calendars
15 must appear before those originally from more recent calendars.

16 Sec. 15. ORDER OF CONSIDERATION OF CALENDARS. Except for
17 local, consent, and resolutions calendars and congratulatory and
18 memorial calendars, consideration of calendars shall be in the
19 order named in Section 7 of this rule, subject to any exceptions
20 ordered by the Committee on Calendars. Bills and resolutions on
21 third reading shall have precedence over bills and resolutions on
22 second reading.

23 Sec. 16. DAILY CALENDARS, SUPPLEMENTAL CALENDARS, AND LISTS
24 OF ITEMS ELIGIBLE FOR CONSIDERATION. (a) Calendars shall be
25 prepared [printed] daily when the house is in session. A [printed
26 copy of each] calendar must be posted on the electronic legislative
27 information system [shall be placed in the newspaper mailbox of

1 ~~each member~~] at least 36 hours if convened in regular session and 24
2 hours if convened in special session before the calendar may be
3 considered by the house, except as otherwise provided by these
4 rules for the calendar on which the general appropriations bill is
5 first eligible for consideration on second reading when convened in
6 regular session. Deviations from the calendars as posted [~~printed~~
7 ~~and distributed~~] shall not be permitted except that the Committee
8 on Calendars shall be authorized to prepare and post [~~print and~~
9 ~~distribute~~], not later than two hours before the house convenes, a
10 supplemental daily house calendar, on which shall appear:

11 (1) bills or resolutions which were passed to third
12 reading on the previous legislative day;

13 (2) bills or resolutions which appeared on the Daily
14 House Calendar for a previous calendar day which were not reached
15 for floor consideration;

16 (3) postponed business from a previous calendar day;
17 and

18 (4) notice to take from the table a bill or resolution
19 which was laid on the table subject to call on a previous
20 legislative day.

21 In addition to the items listed above, the bills and
22 resolutions from a daily house calendar that will be eligible for
23 consideration may be incorporated, in their proper order as
24 determined by these rules, into the supplemental daily house
25 calendar.

26 (a-1) If the house is convened in regular session, [~~a~~
27 ~~printed copy of~~] the calendar on which the general appropriations

1 bill is first eligible for consideration on second reading must be
2 posted on the electronic legislative information system [~~shall be~~
3 ~~placed in the newspaper mailbox of each member~~] at least 144 hours
4 before the calendar may be considered by the house. The posted
5 [~~printed copy of that~~] calendar must indicate the date and time at
6 which the calendar is scheduled for consideration by the house,
7 which date and time must be in accordance with Rule 8, Section 14.

8 (b) In addition, when the volume of legislation shall
9 warrant, and upon request of the speaker, the chief clerk shall have
10 prepared [~~printed and distributed to the members,~~] a list of Items
11 Eligible for Consideration, on which shall appear only:

12 (1) house bills with senate amendments that are
13 eligible for consideration under Rule 13, Section 5, including the
14 number of senate amendments and the total number of pages of senate
15 amendments;

16 (2) senate bills for which the senate has requested
17 appointment of a conference committee; and

18 (3) conference committee reports that are eligible for
19 consideration under Rule 13, Section 10.

20 (c) The [~~A copy of the~~] list of Items Eligible for
21 Consideration must be posted on the electronic legislative
22 information system [~~placed in the newspaper mailbox of each member~~]
23 at least six hours before the list may be considered by the house.

24 (d) The time at which [~~the copies of~~] a calendar or list is
25 posted on the electronic legislative information system [~~are placed~~
26 ~~in the newspaper mailboxes of the members~~] shall be time-stamped on
27 the originals of the calendar or list.

1 (e) No house calendar shall be eligible for consideration if
2 it is determined that the rules of the house were not complied with
3 by the Committee on Calendars in preparing that calendar.

4 (f) If the Committee on Calendars has proposed a rule for
5 floor consideration of a bill or resolution that is eligible to be
6 placed on a calendar of the daily house calendar, the rule must be
7 printed and a copy distributed to each member. If the bill or
8 resolution to which the rule will apply has already been placed on a
9 calendar of the daily house calendar, a copy of the rule must also
10 be posted with the [~~be attached to the printed~~] calendar on which
11 the bill or resolution appears. The speaker shall lay a proposed
12 rule before the house prior to the consideration of the bill or
13 resolution to which the rule will apply. The rule shall be laid
14 before the house not earlier than six hours after a copy of the rule
15 has been distributed to each member in accordance with this
16 subsection. The rule shall not be subject to amendment, but to be
17 effective, the rule must be approved by the house by an affirmative
18 vote of two-thirds of those members present and voting, except that
19 the rule must be approved by an affirmative vote of a majority of
20 those members present and voting if the rule applies to a tax bill,
21 an appropriations bill, or a redistricting bill. If approved by the
22 house in accordance with this subsection, the rule will be
23 effective for the consideration of the bill or resolution on both
24 second and third readings.

25 Sec. 17. POSITION ON A CALENDAR. (a) Unless removed from
26 the calendar under Subsection (b) of this section, once a bill or
27 resolution is placed on its appropriate calendar under these rules,
